Staffing

The school is currently advertising for a Principal Teacher as Greer Norquoy will retire at the end of this school year. This post will be interviewed for on 15th May.

Anne Phillips is retiring at the end of this school year. The school is awaiting a decision from Orkney Islands Council in respect of advertising this vacancy.

The school currently has quite a large number of temporary appointments in post, we are awaiting a decision from Orkney Islands Council in respect of advertising these posts as permanent positions.

Jonathon McCabe will complete his probationary year as a teacher with the end of this school year. Orkney Islands Council has informed me that a new probationary teacher will be placed with us for next academic year.

I am awaiting the appointment to the Principal Teacher post before making final decisions about which teachers will be allocated to which year groups for August 2012. The only decisions that have been made to this point are that the current teaching teams in the Nursery and in Primary 1 will remain as they are for next school year.

Charis Hourston has joined the nursery staff for this term as an additional early years worker as the number of children in one nursery session a day has more than twenty children attending. I welcome Charis to the staff of the school.

School improvement plan – progress

We have focused this year on developing reading and mathematics. Considerable progress has been made towards developing the teaching of these areas this year. We will be looking closely at the standards the children achieve in order to judge the impact of these initiatives. It is likely that we will continue to develop these two important areas of the curriculum next school year. The outcomes will be written guidance for teachers and support staff to ensure consistency and progression across the school in the learning of reading and mathematics across the school.

I have observed all the teachers delivering a PE lesson. This was to monitor the impact of the training delivered by Orkney Active Schools and to audit our delivery of two hours of curriculum based PE for every child.

<u>ICT</u>

There has been a focus this year on using ICT to enhance the learning of children with additional learning needs. Funding was found for new equipment and software for a number of children, this has been supported by the IT section of Orkney Islands Council. The school is in the process of developing its general ICT provision in partnership with Orkney Islands Council.

Finance from Parent Group via friends of Dounby School has been used to purchase new cameras for each class and a new video camera. Further video equipment will also be bought using FODS money. Many thanks to parents, carers, and their families and friends for supporting FODS events.

The school has continued to use electronic means to communicate with parents and carers. The Dounby School Diary which can be accessed via the school website is used to show parents and carers the range of events that children are involved in at school.
